SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES

4.1. Description of First Aid Measures

4.2. Most Important Symptoms and Effects Both Acute and Delayed

Inhalation: Irritation of the respiratory tract and the other mucous membranes.

Skin Contact: Prolonged exposure may cause skin irritation.

Eye Contact: Contact causes severe irritation with redness and swelling of the conjunctiva.

Ingestion: Ingestion may cause adverse effects.

4.3. Indication of Any Immediate Medical Attention and Special Treatment Needed

SECTION 5: FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

5.1. Extinguishing Media

Suitable Extinguishing Media: Use extinguishing media appropriate for surrounding fire. Water spray, dry chemical, foam, carbon dioxide.

Vacuum must be fitted with HEPA filter to prevent release of particulates during clean-up. Transfer spilled material to a suitable container for disposal. Contact competent authorities after a spill.
