# SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES

## 4.1. Description of First-aid Measures

**General:** Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. If you feel unwell, seek medical advice (show the label where possible).

#### 4.2. Most Important Symptoms and Effects Both Acute and Delayed

General: Skin sensitization. May damage fertility. May damage the unborn child.

Inhalation: Prolonged exposure may cause irritation.

Skin Contact: May cause an allergic skin reaction. Contact with hot wax may cause thermal burns.

Eye Contact: May cause slight irritation to eyes. Contact with hot wax may cause thermal burns.

Ingestion: Ingestion may cause adverse effects.

Chronic Symptoms: May damage fertility or the unborn child.

#### 4.3. Indication of Any Immediate Medical Attention and Special Treatment Needed

If exposed or concerned, get medical advice and attention. If medical advice is needed, have product container or label at hand.

#### SECTION 5: FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

#### 5.1. Extinguishing Media

Suitable Extinguishing Media: Water spray, fog, alcohol-resistant foam, carbon dioxide (CO<sub>2</sub>), dry chemical powder.

**Unsuitable Extinguishing Media:** Do not use a heavy water stream. Use of heavy stream of water may spread fire. Do not use water when molten material is involved, contact of hot product with water will result in a violent expansion as the water turns to steam causing explosion with massive force.

#### 5.2. Special Hazards Arising From the Substance or Mixture

Fire Hazard: Not considered flammable but will burn at high temperatures.

**Explosion Hazard:** Product itself is not explosive but if dust is generated, dust clouds suspended in air can be explosive. **Reactivity:** Hazardous reactions will not occur under normal conditions.

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### 5.3. Advice for Firefighters

Precautionary Measures Fire: Exercise caution when fighting any chemical fire.

**Firefighting Instructions:** Remove containers from fire area if this can be done without risk. Avoid raising dust. Do not breathe fumes from fires or vapors from decomposition. Use water spray or fog for cooling exposed containers.

**Protection During Firefighting:** Do not enter fire area without proper protective equipment, including respiratory protection.

Hazardous Combustion Products: Thermal decomposition generates: Carbon oxides (CO, CO<sub>2</sub>). Nitrogen oxides. Ketones. Aldehydes. Organic compounds. Irritating fumes. Acetic acid.

**Other Information:** Do not allow run-off from fire fighting to enter drains or water courses. Do not add water to molten material as this may cause spattering.

Contact competent authorities after a spill.
